

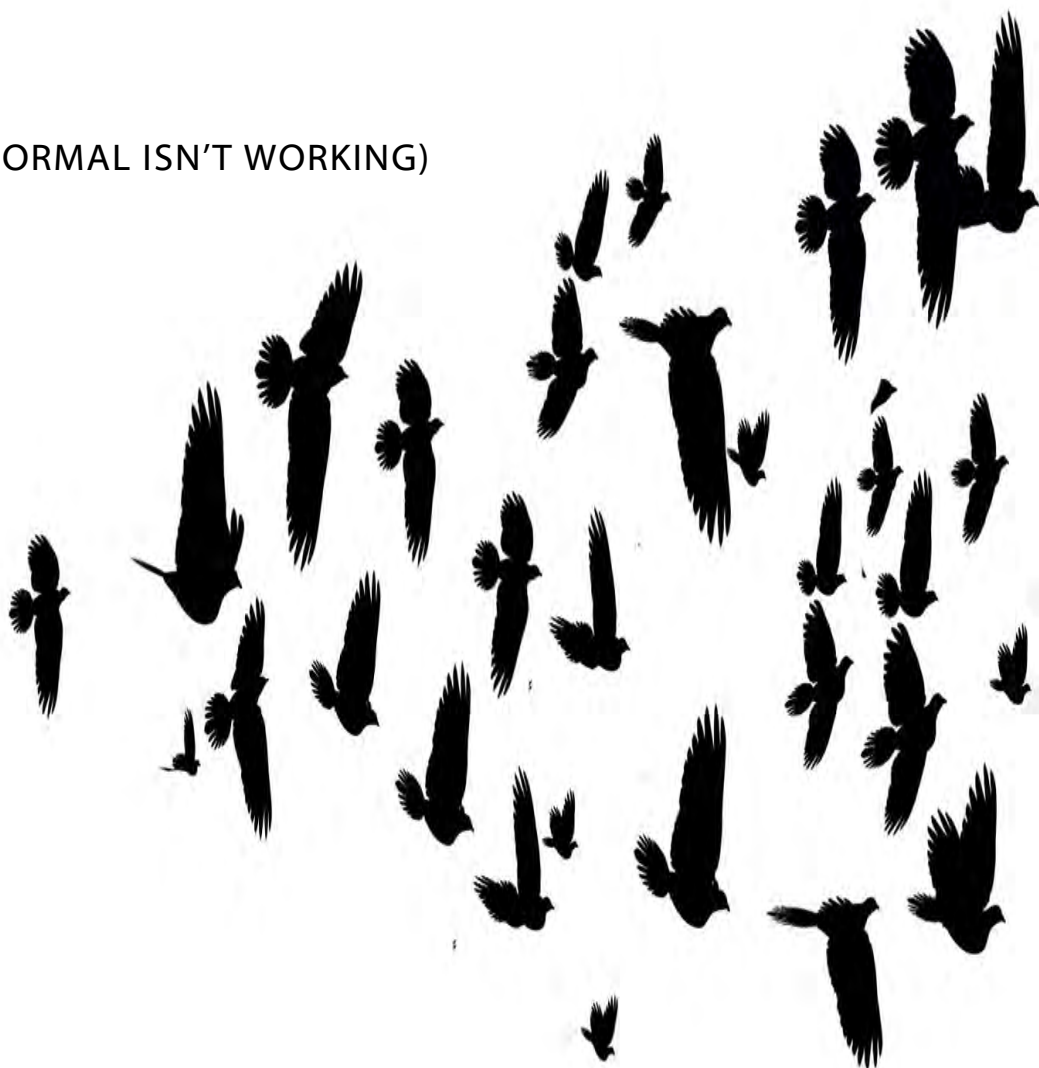

## Father/ Son Class

**Top Ten List of the Most Bizarre Rites of Manhood**

I am a father of 3 boys, Danny 15 and twin 5 year olds, Talon and Garrett. One evening in late December, as I contemplated what true Manhood is and what I could do to provide direction for my boys, I did what all tech savvy fathers do, I googled the topic. After sifting through a bunch of less than acceptable or appropriate blogs, I came across a top ten list of the most Bizarre Rites of Manhood around the world. Here are three of my favorites:

**Land Diving**

The men and boys of the island of Vanuatu in the Pacific climb 30 meter rickety wooden towers before tying vines to their ankles and jumping headfirst towards the ground. Miscalculations in the vines length can have horrific consequences causing awful injuries or even death. When the boys land dive, their mothers throw items away also that represent their childhood. After completing these terrifying leaps of faith these boys are considered men.

**Bullet Ants**

In Ethiopia, for Hamar men to have the right to marry, they must jump naked over the backs of castrated cattle in order to be rid of their childhood. The man is then welcomed into the ranks of "Maza" in the tribe. According to Wikipedia, the man-to-be must "jump the cattle" four times to be successful. This test is performed while naked (except for a few cords bound across the chest) as a symbol of the childhood he is about to leave behind him.

Perhaps we could try these, *OR . . . perhaps not!*

I decided to do some more research. This time I turned to Men's Fraternity, an organization made up of Christian Fathers that share what our Father God has to say about manhood. After going through their six week program for fathers and sons, reviewing it with the Men's Ministry team and JR Horn, FCC's Student Minister, we decided to make the program available to fathers and sons at First Christian Church this Winter. Starting February 19th at 9am in room 205 we are having the first of 6 sessions in the Men's Fraternity's program "Becoming a Man." We will watch a 40 minute video each week and then take a few minutes to discuss the video content, in hopes to discover, reinforce and learn what the Bible has to say about manhood.
